




HD Intakes



Home Detention had 42 intakes with 30 felonies (72% Level 6), 8 misdemeanors (75% AM), and 2 status offenses.


HD Exits

With a total of 38 exits, only 5 adults were unsuccessful (17%). **ALL juveniles** were successful in the HD program this period.



1/142 (1%) drug screens conducted resulted in a home detention program violation

6811 telephone contacts were made


PTS Defendants by Level of Supervision




The **Pretrial Services** program began October 2019. Since then 157 defendants have been provided pretrial services through both Superior and Circuit courts.

As of 2/28/20 data entry, community service hours were completed at non-profit agencies in and around Whitley County during this time period by a total of 271 participants. A total of 8599 hours was completed with 4605.25 occurring in Whitley County. This converts to \$33,388.06

WR Intakes




Of the 91 WR intakes, 53% were Level 6 felonies. 15 of the 16 misdemeanors were A misdemeanor offenses.


Misdemeanor intakes have decreased by 10% while felonies have increased by 10% over the same time period, from 2018 to 2019.

WR completion and termination numbers have remained consistent from 2018 to 2019. In October, the female wing was expanded by 6 beds, to 24 to better serve the community.


Successful WR Completions




WR Terminations




25 MRT Referrals

3 participants in DV - MRT referred by probation have successfully completed the program since August 2019.


EMPLOYMENT SERVICES PROGRAM

The ESP served a total of 58 WR participants with 3 additional referrals from home detention and 2 from probation.


97% of the participants from WR have started employment within 30 days this period and 84% of the participants from WR have started employment within 14 days.

Two of the three terminations from the employment program were self-termination from the work release program.

FORENSIC DIVERSION




The annual report reflected 306 individuals seen in 2019 through the A&D program; 38% female and 63% male. 87% were caucasian with 11% black or African American.

143 (47%) individuals reported income less than \$14,999

51 (17%) reported less than a high school/HSE education

107 (35%) reported unemployment
